We've had a very busy week in school and of course it is our first full week back too. There are a few tired faces in class as all of the children have been working incredibly hard. We are amazed with how well they have settled into their classes this year and are very impressed with the standard of work being produced across school.

This week our clubs and extra-curricular activities have started and it has been great to see how busy these have been. The Den Building and Orienteering Club on a Tuesday is now full. The children had a great session over on the field on Tuesday. Science club kicked off their first session with an experiment cleaning up some pennies. Geography club used Digimaps to create maps of the school grounds and have designed their own orienteering trails.

During lunchtimes, our Playground Leaders have started and it has been lovely to see children of all ages playing and interacting during these sessions. Lego, Chess, Young Voices and Ethos have also all been very well attended and it is great to hear how

excited the children are about all of these activities. These clubs will change as the year progresses and different year groups will get the opportunity to participate in a range of clubs.

On Thursday morning, our Ladybirds and Butterflies had a fabulously fun session of

Clever Ending Stories. This session includes stories, music and movement and is a great way of building up those early Literacy skills plus their fine and gross motor control. At the end of the session the company that had come in to lead this commented to say that in 20 years of working in schools this was by far the best group of pupils they have encountered. We think this is a great thing to hear especially as it is only the first full week in school for these children. Well done Ladybirds and Butterflies!



Your suggestions for further development:

A lot of emphasis is placed on English and Maths and the success of the child depends on how good they are 'academically'. I don't think the school does enough to

celebrate other subjects/other areas of the curriculum where children can excel.

Better communication about events/dates for diary.

Better communication over timetable ahead of term i.e. PE/swimming.

Sometimes the only chance you get to see the teacher is on the school gate, can be a busy time to talk although you can contact through the APP but sometimes it is better to talk face to face.

As a school we try very hard with communication between home and school. Dates for the year are always on the school website on the calendar and holiday dates can be found in the parents section of the website. Upcoming dates for your diary are also always on the school newsletter each week. Additionally, emails regarding clubs and events go out every half term. Reminders are sent via emails and the school text messaging system. Messages regarding PE and swimming were sent out last year via email and Seesaw. We will try to add more reminders via text message so parents know when these sessions are happening.

Last year we continued to offer our Open Sessions in addition to more formal parent

evenings throughout the year. These sessions have proved very popular and have been a great way of keeping families updated on what the children have been learning in class. We will be continuing with these sessions in 23/24 and dates are already in the diary.

We are thrilled that so many of you recognise our commitment to wider curriculum. At WLSJ we do not narrow our curriculum offer with core subjects (English and Maths)

limited to morning sessions and each afternoon dedicated to the wider curriculum. In

addition to our regular curriculum offer we aim to enhance and enrich the curriculum with a range of visits, visitors and experiences. Last year we ran two residential trips, day trips to Windmill Farm and Southport, we offered participation in over 30 clubs and

inter-school competitions (more than we have ever done before), welcomed in visitors for our History, DT and RE curriculum, hosted an Aspirations week, participated in the Young Voices concert and the Big Sing, performed live at our Nativity and end of year

productions and supported a range of charities.

We already have lots of exciting plans for 23/24 for continuing to bring our curriculum to life and we are sure the children will really enjoy what we have planned.
